Regarding questions about the public hearing requirement for amendments to the zoning ordinance, Section 607 of the ordinance requires that Council schedule a public hearing and publish notice 30 days prior to the hearing in at least one newspaper. #### 5. FISCAL OFFICER REPORT

Total receipts for the month of July were \$36,834.50 and expenditures were paid for the month totaling \$13,714.54. Included in receipts is \$13,969 in special assessments for delinquent

sewer accounts and \$1,821 from the 2<sup>nd</sup> half property tax distribution. Expenditures include \$1,780 at McAuiliffe's Ace for concrete and concrete supplies used to anchor playground equipment and \$1,391 to McKeever to pump the lift station during a power outage. Additionally, \$160 was received from Champaign County Juvenile Court as part of restitution for damage at the ball park. A total of \$310 has been received so far. North Lewisburg's claimed sewer service balance is \$130,299.93.
