4. FISCAL OFFICER REPORT


Total receipts for the month of October were \$15,564.77 and expenditures were paid for the month totaling \$10,330.51. Expenses included \$246 to USTI for sewer billing cards, \$382 to Holt for a water filter system, and \$250 to R&R Construction for gutter work on the municipal building.

Expenditures included \$478 to Spain's for repair of a hydraulic leak and replacement of the fuel filler neck on the dump truck, \$274 to Clayton for truck tires, and \$315 to Covalen for pump parts.

The temporary appropriations ordinance to be considered later in the meeting expires on March 31. It closely resembles the Tax Budget approved earlier this year. Council members are asked to use it as a starting point when considering what the permanent budget should include. The permanent budget should be adopted at the March meeting or earlier.

Resolution 2019-04R is the familiar Public Defender Agreement which commits the Village to pay for the legal defense of indigent Village residents who violate Village ordinances and are subject to incarceration.

A resolution is proposed authorizing the transfer of up to \$35,000 from the General Fund to the Street Fund for the purpose of replacing the dump truck. The old truck has become expensive to maintain and unreliable. Additionally, the resolution authorizes a supplemental appropriation of \$35,000 within the Street Fund for that purpose. This resolution is retroactive because \$4,000 was moved to fund a deposit on a replacement truck available at auction in November. Bidding was unsuccessful and the \$4,000 remains in the Streets Fund.

Finally, a retroactive resolution is proposed to cover unbudgeted maintenance labor within the Street Fund, mostly due to issues with the truck.
