Champaign-Clark Village Pool audit update. Since the last meeting, five independent accounting firms submitted bids for audit services for the pool for the next three audit periods through 2020. Each Village was allowed to assign five points total to the evaluation scores, and Woodstock's were assigned to Balestra, Harr, Scherer, Inc. based on hourly rate and total cost. This firm was eventually awarded the contract and the first audit will begin in the Spring. Their bid indicates that they'll be less expensive than an audit conducted by the Auditor of State.

5. MAYOR'S REPORT

The Mayor stated that a resident complained about firearms being discharged in the Village. Ohio Basic Code prohibits this within the municipality corporation limits. The resident also complained about trash burning. This is also prohibited by law and the resident was advised to notify the Sheriff. Further, the resident expressed concern that not all residents are paying the Village income tax. The resident was advised that RITA reconciles local income tax records with other tax records for purposes of enforcement.
