7. VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Herron stated that he hadn't heard back from Miami Valley Lighting. He was told by DP&L that they still provide Night Guard fixtures and plan to continue. A layout showing the locations of street light poles and the cost of installing the two proposed fixtures on various poles was distributed. Preference was expressed for locating them on every other pole beginning with the pole located at the cemetery entrance. The proposal states that installation could be scheduled as far out as 90 to 120 days. Zizzo questioned the use of high pressure sodium fixtures which aren't the most current technology. Herron will follow up.
