FISCAL OFFICER REPORT							
Total receipts for the month of October were \$14,781.24 and expenditures were paid for the month totaling \$50,465.92. Expenditures included \$36,453 for 15 new grinders and accessories from Covalen, \$850 to Rusty Pence for work backing up Ron, and \$1,563.48 to the Woodstock Preservation Alliance. This expenditure is a donation of the balance of the American Rescue Plan Fund approved at the last meeting. North Lewisburg's most recent invoice (10/25/2024) shows a balance due of \$141,286.11.

MAYOR'S REPORT

6. PUBLIC

A resident stated that the web site hasn't been updated for a while and he'd like to know where to find copies of the minutes of meetings. Hallinan stated that he has been having computer issues and is re-constructing the web site. Copies of minutes are being e-mailed to anyone on request.

A resident asked if the municipal building would be available for a Santa Claus event on December 15, at no cost to the Village. Council agreed and asked the resident to contact Ron who coordinates use of the building. Also, the resident stated that there is a tree in front of her house which has caused power interruptions in the past. She stated that DP&L told her that it was the Village's responsibility to correct the problem. The Mayor and Herron stated that the Village is not responsible for trees and that they are the responsibility of the homeowner. The same applies to sidewalks.

Bryant Bailey asked what he needs to do next to move forward with his tiny homes project. Herron stated that he needs to apply for a conditional use. He also re-iterated that the Village is unable to approve any sanitary sewer connections at this time. Bailey stated that he would need to install a small treatment facility on his property. Herron stated that he believes that such an installation is not permitted because of the existing sewer system. Bailey asked what the contingency plan is if North Lewisburg declines to continue sewer service. Herron stated that options are being evaluated and that public comment can't be made at this time.

In response to several questions about the status of the service agreement, Herron stated that there is a court-ordered mediation scheduled for December 5. We don't know what the outcome of the mediation will be, but it doesn't make sense at this point to begin expensive engineering studies until we know for sure that the existing infrastructure can't be used.

Further discussion included Bailey's desire to leverage the portion of his property in Rush Township for sewage handling from his site, North Lewisburg's ability to choke Woodstock's growth, and the incorrect perception that Woodstock isn't paying anything for sewer service, and clarification of Bailey's next steps and the current roadblock.

Resident Sarah Buchanan stated that the street lights are still out. Herron stated that AES has been notified and they'll schedule the repair.

The issue of donating the fire truck to the Woodstock Community Church was brought up. No decision was reached.
