A letter from Woodstock Preservation Alliance was received last month. The organization is a newly formed 501(c)(3) created to preserve Woodstock Community Church. The organization is requesting funds to secure the outside of the church for moisture prevention. \$6,436.27 is needed. Council previously determined that American Rescue Plan funds could be used for that purpose, but the fund has a current unencumbered balance of around \$1,500. A resolution to appropriate the balance for donation to the alliance will be presented at the next meeting.
